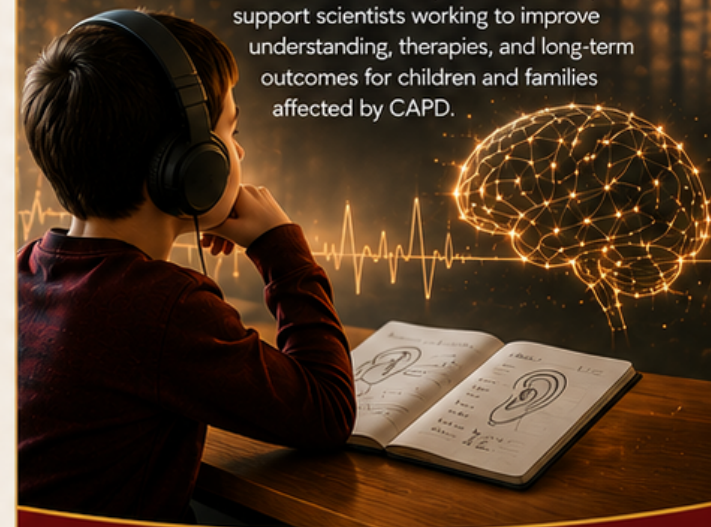

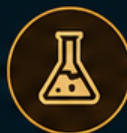

R.A.R.A. works alongside respected organizations dedicated to advancing hearing science and auditory research.

KEY PARTNERSHIPS INCLUDE:



Through the Emerging Research Grants program, R.A.R.A. supports promising scientists conducting research related to auditory processing and hearing science.

R.A.R.A. has contributed approximately **\$1.6 million** toward Hearing Health Foundation initiatives, helping leverage an estimated **\$43.2 million** in additional matching grants and institutional funding.



Since 2011, R.A.R.A. and Autism Speaks have collaborated in support of research and educational initiatives focused on auditory challenges associated with autism.

This partnership has included more than **\$1 million** in pledged support and establishment of the first Royal Arch Masons Fellowship in 2016.



Together, these partnerships help accelerate research, increase awareness, and improve lives.
